# Malaysia

Sample Itinerary Programme



### 3 Days / 2 Nights Kuala Lumpur Programme

#### Day One

Depart for an architectural tour of Kuala Lumpur. The tour will begin at Kuala Lumpur Railway Station, built in 1911 and noted for its graceful colonnaded Arabic arches, domed minarets, spires and turrets. Its interior design inspiration is that of the much larger Victoria Railway Station in London. Then, proceed to see colonial Kuala Lumpur, an old centre for British rule, featuring Independence Square, Sultan Abdul Samad Building (a Moorish secretariat headquarters built in 1895), the Tudor-styled Royal Selangor club built in 1884 and St. Mary's Anglican Church built in 1894.

Our next stop will be the Petronas Twin Towers at KLCC. Designed by Cesar Pelli, these impressive 88-storey towers, clad in brilliant stainless steel and glass, stand out for more than just their height, they set new standards of design.





## Day Two (Batu Caves Tour)

We will start at Batu Caves, a massive limestone outcrop that lies across the scarred landscape of an old tin mine. The cave is the site of a yearly religious festival called Thaipusam. At the base of the outcrop lies a small Hindu shrine displaying Hindu deities. The cathedral cave is most breathtaking with light streaking down from gaps in the ceiling. We then proceed to Royal Selangor Pewter. A guided tour of the world's biggest pewter centre will fascinate you with the beautiful objects that can be produced from raw tin ore. Marvel at the skillful processes of casting, molding, hammering, engraving and polishing.



## Day Three (Putrajaya Tour)

Our first stop will be Taman Warisan or Agricultural Heritage Park, a living museum for mango, rubber, cocoa, palm oil, durian, jackfruit, herbs, etc. Next proceed to Putrajaya Government Centre, where numerous new government complexes are located. The most imposing structure in Putrajaya is the pinkish Putra Mosque. Standing beside Dataran Putra and facing the Putrajaya Lake, it incorporates architectural elements from Turkistan, Kazakhstan and Morocco. Another eye-catching building is the Prime Minister's office - Putra Perdana.

## Day Four
